Il Vittoriale degli Italiani

Set on the shores of Italy’s Lake Garda in Gardone Riviera, Il Vittoriale degli Italiani (The Shrine of Italian Victories) was once home to the eccentric writer Gabriele D’Annunzio. Surrounded by a large garden with views across the sparkling waters of the lake and the mountains beyond, the spectacular setting makes the Vittoriale worth seeing for that alone.

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Cascate di Molina

A few kilometres from Verona, in a spectacular natural setting, the Waterfall Park in Molina is waiting for you to discover the breathtaking beauty of its falls. Treat yourselves to a break and enjoy the surrounding nature and culture: nearby, you will find the atmosphere of the ancient hamlet of Molina enchanting.



Ville Palladiane

The Palladian villas of the Veneto are villas designed by architect Andrea Palladio, all whose buildings were erected in the Veneto, the mainland region of north-eastern Italy then under the political control of the Venetian Republic. Most villas are listed by UNESCO as part of a World Heritage Site named City of Vicenza and the Palladian Villas of the Veneto.



Tremosine

Tremosine is set on an upland that falls vertically on the west shore of Lake Garda and is part of the Parco Alto Garda Bresciano. The district offers a wide range of natural beauties, from Mediterranean to alpine environment, with lakes, valleys, hills covered with olive groves and mountains. Here many paths that were once used by the mules take directly to the mountain.



Vicenza and surroundings

The artistic perspective which animates the city and extends to its surroundings, where we witness a fascinating and indissoluble marriage between art and nature. Here the Medieval lives on in the centre of Marostica, while in Bassano there is a direct link to the Renaissance thanks to the bridge of the celebrated architect.

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Castellaro Lagusello

The village of Castellaro Lagusello stands on a hill, overlooking a small lake in the shape of heart, surrounded by the hills of the moraine amphitheatre of Lake Garda.

In the village you will find the Castellaro Castle, dating back to the 12th- 13th century.



Mart Museum

The Museum of Modern and Contemporary Art of Trento and Rovereto, the Mart, is located in Trentino, in northern Italy, and is one of the most important Italian museums. Its large complex has been designed by the Swiss architect Mario Botta, together with the Rovereto engineer Giulio Andreolli, and inaugurated in Rovereto on 15 December 2002.



Soave

On the fringes of Lessinia, swathed in the mists of time, lies this enchanting medieval town, famed for its vintage white wine.

Soave owes its worldwide fame to the Garganega grapes, which are used to make Soave and Recioto wines.
